HELPER TWO cups of peanuts! You mean four cups of rolled oats, don't you?

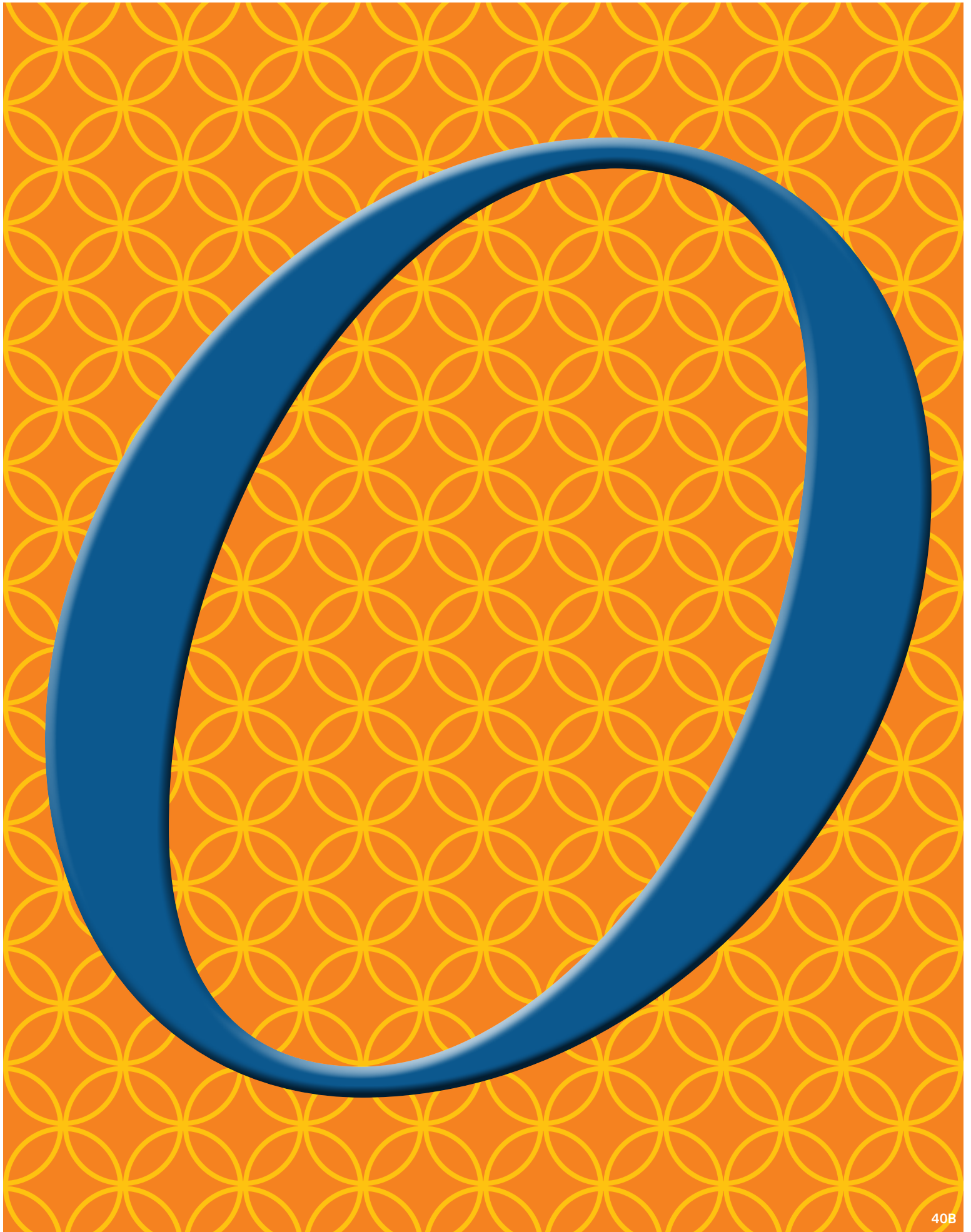
